Projects

1. Select an important event from the book. Write a newspaper article about the event. As you write, try to answer questions such as who, what, when, where, and why.
2. Design a book cover for the book. A piece of construction paper or printer paper folded in half can be used for the cover. On the front of the cover, include eye-catching art work along with the title and author of the book. On the inside, write a one paragraph summary of the book. On the back, write one paragraph that tells your opinion of the book.
3. Create a small poster that advertises the book. Include appealing art work, as well as, the title and author of the book. Write several words, phrases, or sentences that describe the book and that will make people want to read the book.
4. Collect four or five small objects that are related to the book. Place the objects in a zip-lock bag. On a piece of notebook paper, write a short explanation about how each object is connected to the book.

Divisibility Rules

A number is divisible by...

2- if the last digit is even

3- if the sum of the digits is divisible by 3

4- if the last two digits form a number that is divisible by 4

5- if the last digit is a 5 or 0

6- if the number is divisible by both 2 and 3

7- if you can double the last digit and subtract the sum from the rest of the number, and get an answer that is divisible by 7

8- if the last three digits form a number that is divisible by 8

9- if the sum of all digits is divisible by 9

10- if the number ends in 0

Multiplication Practice

In an effort to help our students master their math facts in upper elementary (3rd and 4th graders) and in our 5th and 6th grade academy we are implementing a more systematic Summer Enrichment Process to help our students better be able to apply their math facts to actual curricular objectives.

2nd Graders - should be prepared to learn their 0-5 multiplication tables by September.

3rd Graders - should be prepared to recite their 0-12 multiplication tables and use this information on math assessments given to specifically help students in their math facts application

4th Graders - should be prepared to use Multiplication Madness Skills on time assessments specifically designed to encourage math facts applications.

5th Graders - should be prepared to be Masters of Mathematics and complete timed assessments applying the skills of multiplication, division, mixed numbers, and reducing fractions.
